## GUEST SPEAKER—Lieutenant James B. Suffern, USCG

Lieutenant Suffern is currently assigned as the Chief of Waterways Management at Sector Miami where he has led the charge to restructure the Port of Port Everglades Anchorage, the site of over 10 major vessel groundings. Since his arrival in June 2004, Lieutenant Suffern has served as the Chief of the Contingency Planning Department at Sector Miami where he managed the modifications, compliance, exercise and evaluation for all events, responses, the Area Contingency Plan and Maritime Security Plan. His major accomplishments during his time at Sector Miami include:

- His selection as Planning

Section Chief to the LANTAREA Incident Management Assist Team (IMAT), highly trained & readily deployable, to assist with management support, and Incident Command System expertise, for any major Coast Guard response.

- The successful incident management of the lightering/salvage of the two vessels; the freighter FEDREAL PESCADORES & the freighter CLIPPER LASCO from the reef off Ft. Lauderdale.
- Member of the response team for the M/V Athos I oil spill response in Philadelphia, Prior assignments include serving in the Eighth Coast Guard

District Marine Safety Division as the Pollution Fund Administrator and member of the District Response Advisory Team from June 2001 to June 2004. From November 1999 to June 2001 he was assigned as Investigating Officer and Assistant Command Duty Officer at the Marine Safety Office New Orleans, Louisiana.

Lieutenant Suffern earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Finance from Louisiana State University and Master of Finance and Business Administration from the University of New Orleans. LT Suffern graduated from the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve Officer Candidate School, New London, Connecticut in October 1999.
